

As a result, he was also there when the Seneca Optimists began. He stayed with the Seneca Optimists until the Corps folded. During the intervening years Colin maintained an active connection with the corps and its members.

In addition to the numerous hours spent talking to Don Daber Colin contacted former staff and members of the Scout Band, Opti-Corps, the Toronto Optimists and the Seneca Optimists. His goal was to gather and discuss various versions of stories in an attempt to validate the veracity of the material included.

Sadly, Colin passed away in July 2013 without having had the opportunity to see his book published.
