## THE PAST

1970

The Squires Junior Drum and Bugle Corps originated in the fall of 1964 through the efforts of three local Drum Corps enthusiasts, namely: Mr. Carl Isley, Mr. Charles Calhoun and Mr. Vernon Alling, Jr.

Commencing with the first season of participation in the spring of 1965 with a complement of 35 to 40 young boys and girls the Squires have continued to win the hearts of all in their many appearances throughout the state. The enthusiasm and interest promoted by the Squires among the youth of the area has been and is reflected when comparing membership in 1965 of 40 boys and girls whose age average was 10 to the 1970 complement of 110 and an average age of 14.

Worthy of note and indeed the prime purpose of organization is the principle goal to which the Corps' originators and present directors adhere and which continues to govern the Corps' every activity.

"Our goals, effectiveness, and/or success shall not be measured by the sum of first place performances, which admittedly is extremely important to any 14 year old boy or girl, but rather shall be measured by the number of times this group of young people can be presented as a unit, whether the original 40 or the present 110, extending their sincere efforts in exhibiting to all that which comprises the intent of their inception and subsequent training."

Work together, learn to understand, respect, and allow for the capabilities or incapacities of one another.

The populace of the area join those of us, the directors of the Squires Junior Drum & Bugle Corps, in extending our continued support and congratulations to this youth organization who continue to exhibit excellence in that, the original intent of organization set forth by the founders some six years ago.

The Squires have recently attained a complete and much needed line of new equipment through their individual efforts as well as those of their parents and friends, local industry and business, and a very generous supporting public in general.

Equipping a unit of this type who are not subsidized in any manner per se, necessitates and entails the continual work of adult direction and planning. This year over \$6,800.00 was expended on instruments alone with yet another \$2,500.00 to cover additional uniforms, miscellaneous equipment and instruction costs through the 1970 season. AND MUSIC ARRANGER

# JACK BULLOCK

The Crusaders are pleased to have Mr. Jack Bullock again this season as Music Arranger and Instructor.

Jack is no stranger in drum corps having either played in or instructed and arranged for corps for the last 22 years. He was with the famous Geneva Appleknockers for 15 years first as a horn player then as Arranger-Instructor and marched in 10 American Legion National Competitions.

He is currently a New York State All American Bugle Judge and has had the honor of judging two V.F.W. National Contests, two World Open Championships and last summer judged the U.S. Open in Marion, Ohio. Jack was the Crusaders Drum Major last summer and travelled with the corps to such places as Toronto, Canada, Boston, Massachusetts, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania and Atlanta, Georgia.

Jack was born and raised in Syracuse, New York and attended Ithaca College where he received a Masters Degree in Music. He played lead trumpet in Tony Pastor's band and later taught trumpet at the Army Band School of Europe in Germany.

During the week you will find Jack in the classroom teaching music, as he has for the last 12 years, but on the weekends you will find him leading the Crusaders on the competition field where he is one of the foremost known and respected music men in drum corps.

# HISTORY OF THE CRUSADERS

The old saying "Perfection is the goal of all human endeavor" may well have been the motto of the Crusaders Drum Corps.

From a most imperfect beginning in 1947 in Hilton, New York to the perfection of winning the National American Legion Championship in Portland, Oregon in 1965, the Crusaders have blazed a trail through the drum corps world.

The corps in the last five years has beaten every senior drum corps in the United States and has won every major title except one. The only title not won by the Crusaders is the D.C.A. Championship which this year will be held in Rochester on August 30, and will bring together the 18 finest corps in the country.

This past summer the corps placed 5th in the D.C.A. Championship, 3rd in the American Legion Nationals, and first in the New York State Legion Contest. They traveled to such places as Toronto, Canada, Boston, Mass., Pittsburgh, Pa. and Atlanta, Georgia plus appearing in 20 other cities in the northeast United States.
