## DEDICATION - 1980

As the Squires came to be known as New York's corps of the seventies, it is only appropriate that we give special honor to the Squires man of the seventies, Dennis Morris.

Denny came to the Squires in 1970 as a soprano player. His dedication to the corps distinguished him throughout his career as a marching member. When he graduated from the corps in 1974, Denny moved on to become an assistant drill instructor. In what is a thankless and difficult job, his ability to maintain his sense of humor and uncanny ability to keep things in their proper perspective, while remaining ever optimistic even as the situation seems hopeless, has been an inspiration to all he worked with.

Denny has also served the corps as Vice President of the Board of Directors and as a regular Board Member. This year he will be designing the Squires drill as well as setting up the summer competition schedule. Denny is also working to design the field drills for two of upstate New York's top high school bands - Auburn and Bath-Haverling. In addition to his duties with the Squires, Denny also has taken the task of drill instructor for the Pages.

The Squires and Pages, at the dawn of the eighties, wish to take this opportunity to dedicate the 1980 yearbook to one who has become the personification of the pride, spirit and determination that has maintained the corps in the face of adversity and propelled the corps to the pinnacle of success.

## MESSAGE FROM STAFF AND MANAGEMENT

The start of the 1980 season saw the Squires staff and management take a look at the goals and purpose of the Squires and Pages organization. After this re-examination, a set of guidelines were drawn up to direct the corps in the coming years. These major goals are aimed at continuing the corps' competitive success, yet still making membership practical for any local youngster.

1. School Year Travel - all travel during May and early June will be of a short distance nature. This will allow members to continue to prepare for school exams and cause less conflict with school activities.
2. Spring Practice - the instructional staff has determined that full weekend rehearsals during May and June should be limited to one per month, thus giving members time for work or other activities.
3. Summer Travel - with the exception of the August tour, summer travel will be limited to the weekends. In today's economy, a schedule must be made which will allow members to hold summer jobs. In the past we have lost many members because of this and we hope to reverse the trend.
4. Summer Rehearsal Schedule - the summer rehearsal schedule will return to two nights per week. In the past we have simply "over rehearsed" and this is too much for many members. Proper planning and preparation will make each rehearsal more productive.
5. Renewed Emphasis on the Pages - In the last few years, the Pages had a small membership. This is being felt now by the Squires. We have placed more emphasis on the Pages this year and they have doubled in size. A strong feeder unit is the only way a corps can hope to receive trained young members.

Hopefully, 1980 will see us strengthen our local participation. At this point, local participation is up about 30 percent for both units. Our goal is to provide area youth with a creative and unusual activity and in this time of economic unrest, we must be sensitive to the needs of the members. We hope we have made the right decisions and ask the community to continue their generous support.
