This 1938 swing tune is in much the same style as the Squires past concert tunes "London Bridge" and "Anitra's Dance." Its difficult rhythms and colorful harmonies are a challenge to the player and should be a good opportunity to present a different aspect of Color Guard routines.

This tune was originally written by swing era pianist Oscar LeVant and was popularized by the group Manhattan Transfer.

The Squires close their show with this lyrical Broadway tune from the musical "All American." A soprano solo and the Squires trademark airbags highlight the show's finale.

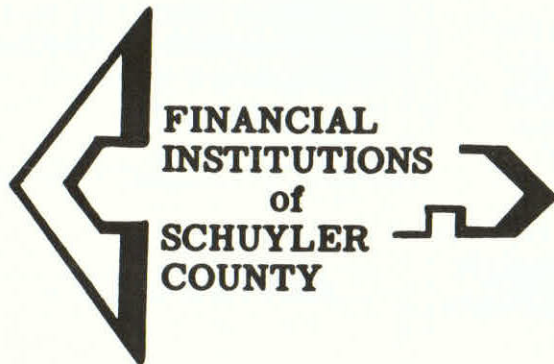

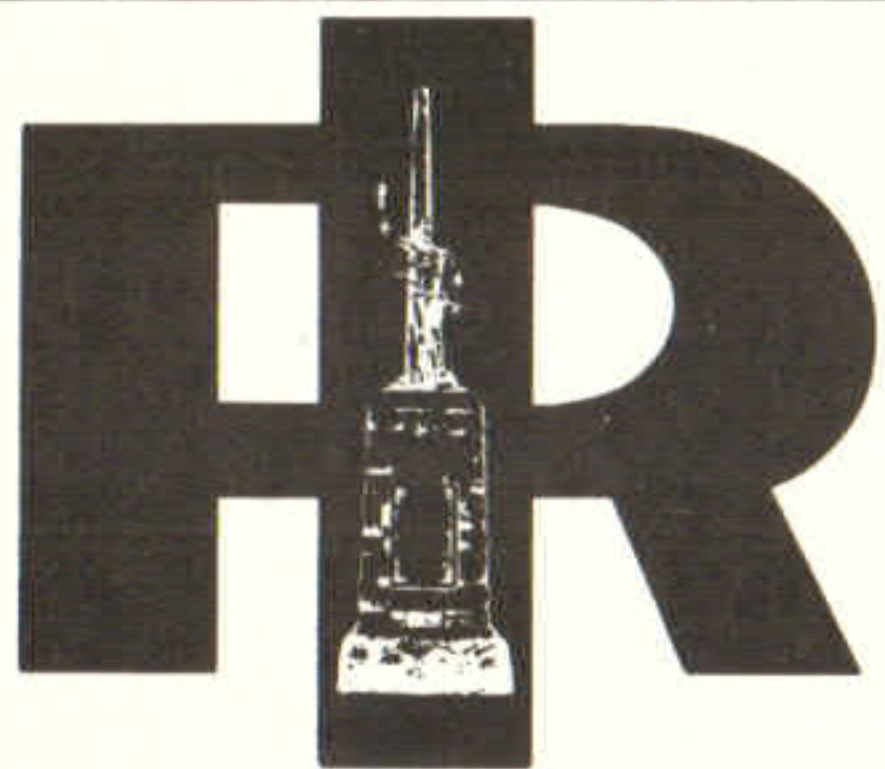

OTHER NOTABLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Since starting field competition in 1967, the Squires have competed in 208 contests. In those 208 contests, the corps has placed first 79 times, made the finals of 30 class 'A' and Open class contests, achieved D.C.I. Associate status (the nation's top 25) five consecutive times and has won four consecutive N.Y.S. championships in the years 1975, '76, '77 and '78.

The Squires Brass Ensemble has compiled an admirable record in three years of D.C.I. Championship competition. In 1978 and 1980 the Ensemble placed second and fourth respectively. The quintet walked off with the D.C.I. Brass Ensemble Championship in the 1979 contest at Birmingham Southern College, scoring a 90.50.

HIGHLIGHTS AND LOWLIGHTS

The Squires highest score in field competition came at approximately 1:00 am on August 7, 1977. The scene was the rain delayed U.S. Open finals in Marion, Ohio where the corps scored an 81.45 and placed 3rd in the contest. Not only is the 81.45 a record for the Squires but the 3rd place ranking is the highest ever for a New York drum corps in the 13 year history of the U.S. Open.

On the down side of things, the Squires scored a dismal 20.33 while placing 19th in a field of 19 at the N.Y.S. American Legion Championship prelims on July 19, 1969 at Niagara Falls' Hyde Park stadium.

HOW MANY?

For 1981 there will be about 101 Squires. By section that will break down to 44 brass, 30 color guard, 23 percussion, 2 drum majors and an American flag section of 2.

The maximum number a corps can have in competition is 128. Although the Squires have never fielded a corps of that size, our total membership has been in excess of 100 during the 1975, 1976, 1977 and 1978 seasons. 1977 and 1978 saw the largest contingents with 114 and 112 members respectively.
